Treasurer's Report: Approved

- 1. Guest Comments on items not on the agenda, none
- **2. Election of Officers** We need equal representation from the 4 communities, in order to nominate and vote for officers.
- **3. SB County Fire Dept** Chief Mike Snow August fire calls, one vehicle, one commercial, 27 medical aid; outside investigations, 41 total calls
 - Wildfire season still upon us. Fire Prevention 1st week of October; change batteries in smoke detectors, make sure chimney is cleaned.
- **4. SB County Fire Dept** Lt. Mike Barta 15 Sheriff Dept vehicles now have license plate readers: 5 each for two contract cities, 5 for unincorporated areas. They pick up license plates passing by. Arsonist had set a series of fires in Yucaipa area, caught last month. Deputies will pick up a stolen vehicle, an Amber alert, or missing person. Two stationary readers planned for Hwy 62.
 - Recent helicopter search over houses on a widespread search had set a series of fires for three Spanish tourists; found stuck in their rental car in the impact area on the Marine Base.
- 5. CalFire Chief Tony Jones unable to attend
- **6. Jim Schooler** Field Representative for State Senator Jean Fuller unable to attend.
- **7. Homestead Valley Community Plan:** Supervisor Ramos' Deputy Chief of Staff Sandra Maravilla e-mailed that the draft for Homestead Valley will be out by the end of the month. Land Use Services is releasing the plans in groups. The County General Plan was to be approved by Sept 2018.
- **8. Hauled Water Ban:** As reported last month, the statewide ban, on building permits for properties which rely on hauled water, remains in effect. We still need cases where a property owner can show damages from being denied a building permit, and a written proof of denial. An analysis of the conflicts with existing codes has begun.
- 9. Ord Mountain and Siena Solar Projects Betty No more news on these two applications.
- **10.** Cleanup at Giant Rock, Saturday, September 8 Audience member who participated said there was a large turnout. The encampment which had left so much trash behind had already bee cleaned up by volunteers who came out before the organized cleanup, but there was still 7-1/2-8 tons removed
