**Minutes** of OCTOBER meeting Approved **Treasurer's Report**: Betty Munson Approved

- 1. Guest Comments on items not on the agenda none
- **2. Election of Officers** We still have an unequal number of delegates from each organization. Each Council member please encourage more representation.
- **3. SB County Fire Dept** Chief Mike Snow October responses: Johnson Valley 4, Joshua Tree 94, Landers 35, Wonder Valley 22, Pioneertown 6, and Yucca Mesa 67: 228 total. 11 fire, 2 unauthorized burning, 148 EMS and rescue calls. public assistance 11. misc News Release handout, "Fire Safety Tips for Fireplaces and other devices" available online. Emergency Vehicles turnout to Means Lake on Sunday was for offroad accident, 2 individuals ejected from Razr, transported by medical helicopter to trauma center.
- **4. SB County Sheriffs Dept** Capt Jeff Joling. Still doing well on property crimes, about 44% decrease. Planning a visual recap showing statistics for a 5-year span of time. 2015 will be a spike. 66% of voters did not read their propositions and Prop 57 (entitled "Public Safety") passed, reclassifying rape and child abuse as non-violent felonies. Also Department of Corrections now decides on prison releases on 5-10 year sentence, not a judge or District Attorney; early releases due to budget estimated at 7,000 released into the communities.anticipated. Actual impact will not be known until 2017. Literature will be available soon on recreational marijuana. No outside growing; restriction on quantity in possession still apply. Large cultivation recent busts reported to special marijuana division whiv will apply several search warrants in one day in the area. Often the people arrested do not even live here. Time will tell the influence of differing distribution regulations in Riverside County. Options are limited. Situation is new to everyone.
  - Discussion OHV trespass and nuisance after hours. Call Sheriffs dispatch, they will respond. They cannot pursue off-road due to risk to personnel and equipment, but will try to keep them away from disturbance in neighborhoods.
- **5.** CalFire Anthony Milnick Correct name on agenda should be Capt Tony Jones. No burn permits being issued in SRAs right now, revamping forms. Should be available soon.
- **6. Jim Schooler** Field Representative from State Senator Jean Fuller. Unable to attend.
- **7. Community Plan Workshop #2** General discussion by Council and guests who attended the final workshop held in Yucca Mesa. Most expressed dissatisfaction with the meeting, and general pessimism as to the results they expect for improving communications with County planners.
  - -Council decided to prioritize our concerns, distribute for Council approval and report to Supervisors Ramos and Lovingood and others involved. Joanna to invite James Ramos to our next meeting.

#### 8. Report on LV-JV and Morongo Basin MACs

-MB MAC - presentation concerning the new mental health crisis center in Joshua Tree.

Mark Lundquist told Rick Sayers there would be enforcement of the Night Sky Ordinance.

-LV-JV MAC- Joanna and Betty did not attend, date was in conflict with the Community Plan Workshop. On the MAC agenda: the Summary of Issues acted on in 2016. It included several with which the HVCC agrees, such as the campaigns for Scenic 247, redrawing the boundaries of the State Responsibility Areas to rid ourselves of the Fire Tax, lifting the ban on hauled water, and agreement with comments to the SPARC forum for renewable energy policy in the County General Plan.
