2. 29 Palms MCAGCC – Cindy Smith: Johnson Valley OHV Shared Use Area closed for military training, Friday, October 22, through Monday, November 1, 2021

3. SB County Fire – Battalion Chief Danny Vilorio: Invite everyone to Disaster Preparation Day in Walmart parking lot this Saturday, Great Shake-out. No burn permits.

4. CAL Fire - Battalion Chief Alison Hesterly: introduced herself and Battalion Chief Travis Lemm, now chiefs of newly-realigned CalFire State Responsibility Areas adjoining Johnson Valley

5. SB County Sheriffs Dept – Capt. Lucas Niles: reported continuing 7th week Operation Hammer Strike. Marijuana Enforcement Team vs illegal pot farms. September calls for service slightly lower (1700), but increase in burglaries, grand theft, assaults, grand theft auto.

6. SB County 3rd District – Representative Steve Reyes:

Code Enforcement weeks 1-7 of Hammer Strike, 317 investigations, \$105, 000 fines

7. State Senator Shannon Grove – Representative Dominic Heiden: Barstow Veterans Center will not close, offers several levels of care, no displacement of current residents.

SB 287, RV trailers will not need commercial license.

EDD fraud prevention bill no go; Democrats identical bill passed. EDD deficit forced layoffs, state borrowed \$20 billion from feds for employment insurance. Payroll taxes will go up.

Kern County in this district, produces 70% of CA energy from fossil fuels. 50% from renewable resources, receives no contribution from tax returns. No local power to halt renewable energy installation.

8. American Red Cross San Bernardino Chapter - Erin Fox, Justin Raymond Merino: Volunteer Recruitment Power Point presentation, by Erin Fox, SBCo District Manager. Described Disaster Action Team, Mass Care, Sound the Alarm appointments to install smoke alarms. Will have booth at Disaster Prep Day in the Walmart parking lot.

SB County and CA State Redistricting – Jim Harvey (latest maps attached): HVCC wants re-district lines to include all four Homestead Valley communities; Jim Harvey submitted info before public redistricting meeting, has attempted to attend for comments at two meetings. County, State, and Federal maps presented to HVCC.
